













# NATIVE PLANTS OF THE UAE

DESCRIPTION	PICTURE
<p><i>Cornulaca monacantha</i> – In Arabic it is known as <i>had</i> and <i>djouri</i> is a straggling, branched, woody shrub growing to a height of 60 centimeters (24 in). It is a desert plant found in the Middle East and the Sahara</p>	
<p><i>Desert hyacinth (Cistanche tubulosa)</i> – Branchless parasite fleshy herb, up to 1m high with erect whitish single stem, simple and up to 4cm thick, stem arise from tuber. Common in coastal areas of the Arabian Gulf coast and on inland saline sand plains.</p>	
<p><i>Arta (Calligonum comosum)</i> – Virtually leafless perennial shrub up to 2.5m tall, stem much branched from thick woody rootstock. Commonly found in sand plains, dunes and roadsides.</p>	
<p><i>Date Palm - Nakhl, Nakheel, Nakhla</i> The tree grows up to 30m tall with a very slender trunk, covered with the remains of sheaths from fallen leaves. Cultivated throughout UAE at all elevations; tolerant to moderate salinity.</p>	

# NATIVE PLANTS OF THE UAE

<p><i>Arfaj (Rhanterium epapposum)</i> – Once a common dwarf shrub in many north-eastern parts of UAE, overgrazing has led to the disappearance of the species in many locations.-</p>	
<p><i>Ausaj (Lycium shawii)</i> – Desert plant, common in the UAE in variety of habitats: gravel plains, hillsides, wadis and plantation.</p>	
<p><i>Safrawi (Dipterygium glaucum)</i> - Perennial shrub but often flowering and fruiting in the first year. Very common in the UAE, along the Arabian gulf coast, often very close to beach lines, also on saline sand inland, except for the southern part of Abu Dhabi emirate.</p>	
<p><i>Shuntop (Pentatropis nivalis)</i> – Perennial vine, twining branches, climber, stems with rough bark; up to 400cm. Commonly found in Sand and gravel habitats, in plantation and low mountains.</p>	

# NATIVE ANIMALS OF THE UAE

<p><i>Oryx leucoryx</i> (Al maha, al baqr, al barra) –</p> <p>The Arabian Oryx is uniform white, while the flank stripe is absent or only an indistinct smudge. Arabian Oryx once occurred over all or most of the plains and deserts of the Arabian Peninsula.</p>	
<p><i>Arabian Red Fox</i> (Al taleb al ahmer)-</p> <p>Is similar in color to the common Red Fox. However, it is more adapted to desert life than its parent species and is a brownish pale red color. Found throughout the UAE and can adapt to all habitats, from desert to mountains, as well as the urban environment.</p>	
<p><i>Caracal</i> (Al hamra, Al washaq) –</p> <p>The caracal is widely distributed through the region. It is typically associated with either well-vegetated or rocky areas but also occurs in dry steppes and semi-deserts, absent only from true desert.</p>	
<p><i>Sindh Saw-scaled Viper</i> (<i>Echis carinatus sochureki</i>) –</p> <p>Saw-scaled vipers reach a maximum length of around 70 cm, but are more commonly around 35-45 cm in total length. They are most commonly found in vegetated sandy desert, gravel plain and arid grassland.</p>

<p><i>Leptien Spiny tailed Lizard (Dhub)</i> – Found only in the UAE and Oman, they live in loose colonies on hard substrates such as gravel plains into which they can dig their deep burrows.</p>	 A photograph of a Leptien Spiny tailed Lizard (Dhub) resting on a sandy surface. <p><i>Zig Zag Ord Spider (Argiope sp.)</i> – Body is large, generally with black and yellow upper parts and a very pale dorsal side. <p><i>Brandts Hedgehogs (Al qunfuz)</i> – Found along the East of the Arabian Peninsula, in the UAE and Oman, preferring mountain oasis and wadi systems with plenty of vegetation, but does come down to the sandy desert plains.</p>	 A photograph of a Brandts Hedgehog (Al qunfuz) on the ground. <p><i>Arabian Hare (Al arnab)</i> – is much smaller than the hares in Europe and Africa. Color may vary from brown to grayish with white undersides. Widespread across the UAE, mainly in open sand and gravel plains in areas with vegetation.</p>	 A photograph of an Arabian Hare (Al arnab) resting on the ground. # ENDANGERED ANIMAL OF THE UAE

<p><i>Socotra Cormorant</i> -</p> <p>is a birds that are restricted to only breeding on islands in the Arabian Gulf and the coast of the Arabian Sea. In 2012 only 12,000 breeding pairs found throughout UAE.</p>	
<p><i>The Hawksbill Turtle</i> –</p> <p>is estimated to have declined in population globally by around 80 percent in the past century. One of the major causes for this has been through hunting for its shell. Population is estimated 8000 adult female around the world.</p>	
<p><i>Sand Cat</i> –</p> <p>The smallest cat in the Arabian deserts, this animal's numbers have declined rapidly in recent years due to destruction of its natural habitat and hunting by farmers. One of the largest colonies of the cats living in captivity is at Al Ain Zoo, with 32 animals.</p>	
<p><i>Arabian Leopard</i> –</p> <p>Likely to see an Arabian leopard in the emirate of Abu Dhabi, they're the smallest breed of leopard, official estimates have put mature adult leopard numbers at no more than 250 animal.</p>

<p><i>Arabian Tahr</i> –</p> <p>The Arabian tahr is the smallest species of tahr. The animal is of stocky build with backward-arching horns in both sexes. lives on steep rocky slopes of Hajar mountain of the United Arab Emirates and Oman at altitudes of up to 1,800 meters above sea level. <p><i>Houbara Bustard</i> –</p> <p>The funky looking houbara bustard is an unfortunate creature. Its lanky shape and plump body has made it traditional prey of falconers and their falcons, hunting it to dangerously low levels.
